Hannam University is a small English-speaking campus located in the center of Daejeon, South Korea. With student-centered, major-driven, and experience-focused principles, Hannam is a campus dedicated to the global citizen.

Hannam University hosts more than 300 international students a year from over 24 countries.

There are approximately 19,000 students on Hannam University's campus.

Daejeon, the fifth largest city in South Korea, has major railways and turnpikes which allow students easy access to any part of Korea—including an hour ride to Seoul, the capital of South Korea. Also, students may visit a variety of landscapes including nearby mountains, rice fields, and coastal fishing. Daejeon is a beautiful city with many nearby mountains and other natural wonders to be visited. It creates a natural environment for mountain climbing.

Korean Language and Culture (3),
Teaching Practicum (3)

The KSSSP program offers students an excellent opportunity to learn about Korean language and culture, as well as the chance to participate in a Teaching Practicum where they gain professional experience. This type of cross-cultural experience will be highly beneficial to participants' cultivation of global citizenship.



The Korean flag is called "Taegeukgi" in Korean. Its design symbolizes the principles of yin and yang in Oriental philosophy.
